In November 2023, we consulted with yourselves to change our education on offer at Hamilton Academy. The proposal was to change schooling on site from Nursery to Year 2 (age 3-7) to an all through primary school providing education from Nursery to Year 6 (age 3-11). This means that there would be provision on site at Hamilton Academy for children to stay within the same setting until they transition to high school.

As part of the bid to the DFE, we had to propose how this change would take shape. We requested that from September 2025 we incorporated a year 3 at Hamilton Academy, then each academic year the provision will grow by one year so by the time we get to September 2028, Hamilton Academy will be a complete primary school providing education on site from Nursery to Year 6.

We are absolutely delighted to announce that the Department for Education (DfE) accepted our proposal and we are able to begin to plan our exciting new venture. We couldn't be happier!

Our current year 1 cohort will be the first year group to benefit from this and be able to stay with us until their transition to high school.

Thank you for your overwhelming support as we went through this Significant Change process, your positive comments and desire to extend the provision were overwhelming and we are sure that when the DfE read your feedback from the questionnaire, they had no choice but to say YES!

















# Thursday, 7th March
